Science of Eliminating Health Disparities

The American Journal of Public Health (AJPH), in collaboration with the National Institutes of Health and FDA Office on Minority Health, intends to publish a **supplement issue** on the topic of **Science of Eliminating Health Disparities**. Original epidemiological, genetic, behavioral, social, and policy-oriented research articles, commentaries, perspectives, and critical reviews of major problem areas related to health disparities in the United States are invited. Papers should emphasize transformational, transdisciplinary, and translational research leading to the elimination of health disparities in the United States. Topics may include: current development and new knowledge in the science of eliminating health disparities; health disparities research with emphasis on improving prevention, diagnostic, and treatment methods; best-practice models in research, infrastructure and capacity-building, outreach, and integrated strategies to find solutions to health disparities; gaps in health disparities research; framework for health disparities research, policy and practice; and innovative and unique partnerships to address disparities in health in all affected communities.

Potential authors should visit the *AJPH* website (<http://www.ajph.org>) to review the Instructions for Authors and specific guidelines for the various types of manuscripts. All manuscripts will undergo standard peer review by the *AJPH* editors and peer referees as defined by the *AJPH* policy. To be considered for inclusion in this supplement, papers must be submitted by **July 1, 2014**, using the online submission system at <http://www.editorialmanager.com/ajph>.
